The Witness Aid Services Unit ("WASU") ensures that crime victims, witnesses, and their families can access the services they need to rebuild their lives, while helping them navigate New York's complex court system.

At the start of 2022, D.A. Bragg enhanced the role of the WASU in Special Victims cases and across the Office. With an emphasis on centering survivors, internal referrals to WASU have increased by 200%.

Through WASU, the Manhattan District Attorney's Office:

- Ensures that all victims, witnesses, and families have a trauma-informed advocacy team to support their experience with the prosecutorial process.
- 2. Increases survivors' access to safety services, resources, referrals, and emotional support in an effort to rebuild lives and restore hope.
- 3. Ensures that victims, witnesses, and families are informed, feel heard and have a voice in the criminal justice process.



The Witness Aid Services Unit is made up of a diverse group of advocate and counselor subject-matter experts who deliver **survivor-centered** and **trauma-informed** services.

Services Offered:

- Safety and needs assessments
- Guidance about the criminal justice system and victims' roles in the process
- Case information and Orders of Protection
- Assistance with transportation
- Accompaniment to court
- Counseling services

- Assistance preparing victim impact statements
- Assistance with relocation, including housing and shelter needs
- Proactive outreach on all domestic violence cases
 Proactive outreach on homicides, vehicular
 crimes, and hate crimes
- Services offered in Spanish, Cantonese, and Mandarin

By the Numbers
